



NEW: From September 2023, we will start collecting your food waste.

You will receive a bin for food waste during the summer/autumn, along with a smaller bin that you can keep inside and bio-bags that you can use to collect food waste.

It is important that only bio-bags are used for food waste. If you need more bio-bags, simply tie a bag onto your food waste bin, and we will leave new bags for you.

We collect some kind of waste from your home almost every week. The calendar below shows what type of waste we collect on each week.

HOUSEHOLD WASTE IS SORTED INTO FIVE CATEGORIES:

- food waste
- glass and metal packaging
- paper/cardboard/cartons
- plastic packaging
- general waste (refuse)

Sorting waste is important in order to reduce our negative environmental impact and to make the best use of resources already produced. It is also necessary in order to ensure you have enough space in your bins.

You should have access to a rubbish bin for each of the categories listed, except plastic packaging which you put in the designated bags we provide you with.

You can also request a red box for hazardous waste such as batteries, paint, light bulbs, and small electronic devices. When the box is full, take it to your local waste reception centre.

You can also bring most other types of waste to your local waste reception centre, free of charge. For example, furniture, large cardboard packages, metal, electrical products, construction waste, garden waste, etc.

We will not collect any waste placed outside of the bins. On collection day, the bin must be placed within max five metres of where the waste collection vehicle stops. Snow must be cleared in the water so that we can easily move the bin. Grit must be put down if it is icy. In the summer, vegetation and grass must not be an obstacle for the bins or the vehicle.

FOOD WASTE

Collect food waste in the bio-bags you have received before putting them in the food waste container.

 **YES, PLEASE!**

- Leftover food
- Fish and seafood
- Vegetable peels
- Coffee grounds
- Used kitchen paper and napkins
- Bread and baked goods
- Eggshells
- Fruit
- Dairy products

 **NO, THANKS!**

- Packaging
- Ashes
- Garden waste
- Houseplants
- Nappies and pads
- Stones and sand
- Dog and cat waste
- Snus and cigarette butts
- Large bones and skins
- Larger amounts of soup/sauce
- Medications
- Disposable cups

Collected every two weeks together with general waste



PLASTIC PACKAGING

Household plastic packaging.
Rinse first if necessary.

 **YES, PLEASE!**

- Plastic bags, bags, cling film
- Plastic bread bags,
- Ham/cheese packaging, etc.
- Plastic bottles and canisters for food, detergents, bodycare products, etc.
- Plastic drink bottles with no deposit.
- Yoghurt pots, etc.
- Trays, cups and packaging for fruit, veg and meat products, flower pots and trays

 **NO, THANKS!**

- NO packaging that has contained hazardous waste
- Hard plastics
- Wood sacks

These should be taken to your local waste reception centre.

Use the bag for plastic recycling!
It is provided once a year. Tie the bag and set it out on collection day.

Collected every four weeks together with cardboard/paper



GLASS/METAL PACKAGING

Glass and metal packaging only.
Rinse first if necessary.

 **YES, PLEASE!**

- Jam jars
- Glass bottles
- Metal tins for food.
- Spread tubes
- Aluminium foil
- Drinks cans without deposit
- Metal caps and lids
- Aluminum trays

 **NO, THANKS!**

- Porcelain
- Ceramics
- Drinking glasses
- Crystal
- Mirrors
- Baking dishes
- Windows
- Frying pans and saucepans
- Nails and screws
- Aerosols
- Cutlery

Collected every eight weeks

CARDBOARD/PAPER



- Paper, newspapers and leaflets
- Small cardboard boxes
- Milk/juice cartons
- Cardboard from food packaging
- Office paper, envelopes
- Kitchen and toilet paper
- Drinking cartons
- Egg cartons
- Pizza boxes



- Paper towels and napkins
- Wet paper
- Glossy wrapping paper
- Used paper cups and plates
- Large quantities of cardboard that do not fit
in the bin should be taken to your local waste reception centre.

NB! Wrapping paper is general waste, it

Collected every four weeks together with plastic



GENERAL WASTE

Everything that cannot be recycled or sorted.



- Nappies
- Clothing, shoes
- Houseplants/flowers
- Products made of composite materials
- Cat litter
- Dog bags
- Wood sacks
- Glossy wrapping paper
- Heavily soiled packaging



- Anything that can be sorted and recycled
- Batteries
- Chemicals
- Electronic waste
- Larger items should be brought to

Collected every two weeks together with food waste



06.00

Bins must be put out by 06:00 if you want to be sure they will be emptied.



FIVE METRES

Make sure bins are max five metres from the roadside that the collection vehicle will drive along to empty them.

ACCESSIBILITY

The bins must be easily accessible. Snow must be cleared and grit must be put down if it is icy. The road should be free from vegetation at a width and height of four metres. There should be no thresholds over 10 cm. If you are going to build a cabin/shed for your bins, please see the guidelines on our website.



CORRECT SORTING

If there is incorrectly sorted waste in the bin, it will not be emptied. Remember that paper/cardboard and glass/metal packaging must NOT be put in bags. Plastic goes in the shiny bag you have received from us and the bag must be tied. Plastic in other types of bags/carrier bags will not be taken.
